Mrs. Harris shares inside view of what makes Yellowstone special

Mrs. Connie Harris, a 3rd-grade educator at Yellowstone, first came to the school in 2008 as a parent and volunteer. She shared her gratitude with supporters as a featured speaker at this year's Party in the Park event. Here are excerpts from her remarks:

What if Yellowstone was never founded 20 years ago? I can tell you that hundreds–maybe even thousands–of children and families wouldn't have access



to a life-changing education or experiences. They'd be in sub-par schools with overcrowded classes, and you can bet many of those students would be falling through the cracks. If Yellowstone was never founded, many students wouldn't answer God's call to walk in his footsteps.

As a Parent: I was so impressed—very small class sizes, Christian teachers, prayer in the classroom. But most importantly, my children participated in faith-building activities.

On Starting the PTO: Yellowstone had a women's Bible study group in the library. Building relationships with other mothers helped redefine who I was in the Lord. Out of the Bible study, the idea of forming a parent-teacher organization evolved to support the students, staff, and other parents. Somehow, I was even convinced to be PTO president!

On Teaching: This school year, I started in my usual Pre-K assistant position, when a role unexpectedly opened up in 3rd grade. Principal Lapid approached me to fill it. I accepted the call, and now I teach 3rd-grade math and love every minute of it. The students are thriving, and so am I!



\$8 million gift a catalyst for educational excellence

Yellowstone. Forever. campaign co-chairs, Anne and Les Csorba and Janet and Brad Childers, recall that the going was tough to raise funds during COVID, and at one point, it looked doubtful that the campaign goal would be met. Then a miracle happened.

Superintendent Dolibois received an unmarked envelope in the mail. Inside was an anonymous \$8 million gift, with a note that read:

Don't be afraid. Move forward with your capital project. God Bless you.

This was the catalyst to proceed ona foundation of faith and re-energized the campaign to double Yellowstone's campus and invest heavily in academics.

Les Csorba sees a new energy on campus as finishing touches are made. "It is so inspirational to see the look on supporters' faces as they tour the grounds," he says. "Yellowstone is truly an oasis of hope and promise, and it would not have been possible without a huge team effort over the last few years."

With new facilities and grounds in place, Csorba believes the next challenge is ensuring that educators, administrators, and, ultimately, students have unmatched resources to pursue a rigorous education. "We have to keep the pipeline filled," he adds, "to build on what has been accomplished to date."

"Our gratitude is immense," says Brad Childers. "Faithfulness, prayers and a vision to accelerate academic excellence are propelling us forward to the next chapter of Yellowstone's history. Your care and support of our students is making an astonishing impact in our community."
