First, thank you for welcoming me with open arms into my new role as Superintendent. It is a blessing to serve the Yellowstone family. I'd like to give special thanks to Ryan Dolibois, our former superintendent, without whose work we would not have our beautiful new campus and the ability to serve our 600 scholars. I am also grateful to

everyone involved in our recently completed *Yellowstone. Forever.* campaign. We exceeded our goal, raising over \$31 million.

Many have asked about my vision for Yellowstone. It's simple—by 2026, we will provide 750 PreK through 12th-grade students with life-changing experiences on one campus in our Third Ward community.

To accomplish this, we must rise to the challenges COVID brought to education, which have had an outsized impact on students of color. We need your help purchasing two new buses and hiring five new staff members to support our students. We also need additional funding to support our Special Education scholars, a need that grows every school year.

Our students deserve a high-quality education. Within a framework of faith, rigorous academics, and an array of support services, you provide a level of opportunity that otherwise wouldn't exist. Your generosity is truly making a profound, genuine difference in the lives of others. Thank you!

Itajha Shields knows first-hand how critical it is to have faith and perseverance to achieve your dreams. She also knows the importance of a support network in helping children reach their full potential.

When she joined the Yellowstone staff as a PreK assistant in 2010, she had no idea what the future would hold. She was promoted to lead teacher, became a Master of Education, and landed her dream job as Yellowstone's dean of lower school students. She remarks, "It's a blessing to have seen my growth along with that of the school."

"It is pure joy to work with our kids," Itajha says. "They are little sponges, and we get to set the tone for their academic experience. Their growth—educationally, spiritually, socially, and emotionally—is tangible, and they need all of our help."

Itajha credits Yellowstone's ability to reach its scholars in new and meaningful ways because the entire staff has the same calling. She points to how everyone worked together during COVID. Teachers, volunteers, administrators, and donors pivoted to ensure students were given adequate resources. From adapting lesson plans, supporting

school renovations, providing needed school supplies, and countless other initiatives, the Yellowstone family stood together. Itajha sees the same spirit today as children are still recovering post-pandemic.

She says, "Caregivers should know their child is loved and safe. And with those two things in place, they can learn, problem solve, and become upstanding citizens."

Counselor's Corner: From rain comes rainbows

Many of Yellowstone's scholars can experience incredible hardships. You are a beacon of light and stability for these children and their families. For all our students, Lead Counselor Carranda Comeaux works to identify when a child needs help so they can learn in the classroom.

She tells of one child who, uncharacteristically, was acting out. It turns out the student was hungry, and her family needed food. With your support, Yellowstone worked with the Houston Food Bank's "Backpack Buddy" program and with H-E-B for a one-time gift card. Soon, the scholar was back on track.

"Our families are often stretched thin, so they may not be able to afford food, supplies, or clothing," Carranda says. "Or worse, some experience abuse, neglect, or criminal incidents beyond their control. We work with our partnerships to secure needed resources. Our children are smart and capable but sometimes need lifting up. "

She is thankful for partnerships like the one Yellowstone has with Ascend Performance Materials, our 8th-grade class sponsor. As the school grows and more needs come to the forefront, Carranda points out that investment in additional counselors and social workers will be critical.

In the meantime, thank you for your generosity in helping so many of our students with challenges that go beyond academics. Your continued support makes a substantial impact on these young lives.

So when two of our buses unexpectedly broke down recently, we urgently needed to replace them. We needed a miracle to cover this expense in addition to the costs of implementing our revamped, intensive academic recovery plan.

Through an anonymous donor, our prayers are being answered with a \$250,000 matching gift.
